D-DAY CEREMONY 2012

Early indications suggested we might have some unsettled weather on June 6th around the David Thompson Resort area. For those of us that have attended this function once or twice in the past, weather of any kind in this area at this time of year would be no surprise. So when the lightning bolt struck during the late news on the



night before and took out the TV system any thoughts of a repeat of last year's sunny ceremony for the next day were soon put to rest. The storm system surged up the foothills from the Calgary area and we prepared to get wet.

To define it, as wet for the parade on the 6th was an understatement; we got drowned. The staging area in front of the Airborne Monument was a quagmire of muck and the low clouds prevented any vision of Mount Ex Coelis we had become accustomed to viewing during previous ceremonies. With this being, the 69th Anniversary of D-Day and the 70th Anniversary of the formation of the 1st Canadian Parachute Battalion, rain be damned, we came to honour these events in ceremony, and that we did.

This year's formation was not as large as in past years; four originals from 1 CAN PARA, a number of airborne veterans from many eras and an element from the 3rd Bn PPCLI's Parachute Company formed the parade. Army Cadets from 2551 RCACC in Edmonton joined in to make it a four-generation contingent on

parade. We didn't use the sound system, it was water logged. We shortened the ceremony. Raincoats came off for most of the members, I mean if the "originals" took off their raincoats what were we going to do, 1 CAN PARA Veteran Pte (Ret'd) Bill Talbot took the salute. LCol (Ret'd) Moffat did his best to keep the pipes dry and along with Sgt Dave Morgan from the RCA Band they performed the necessary tunes to complete the service. MGen (Ret'd) Herb Pitts gave us some words of encouragement and after wreaths were laid Capt (Ret'd) Gord Carter dismissed the parade and we had a short photo shoot.

This ceremony was a test of the dedicated and the stalwart, we did the honours, and we kept the faith. Those that attended know the sacrifice and will do it again.



Earlier that morning, the climb team from 3 PPCLI, Para Coy departed the DTR to ascend Normandy Peak. They were accompanied by members of the Gallant family with our fallen comrade Al Gallant's ashes. It turned out to be a treacherous climb. A couple of family members exited the climb early. The Patricia climb team called it quits at the 1600 ft level as the going became too dangerous and they returned in time to join the parade. Unknown at the time, family members had left and taken a wrong turn on their retreat and got lost, which was not known by the remainder of us until after the parade when they failed to show up at the

DTR. The Patricia's returned to the area and in conjunction with a local RCMP training exercise team set up a Command Post and began searching for the missing family members. It took a while!

In the meantime, the reception back at the Bubble Tent at the DTR wiped away any discomfort of the previous three hours for most of the members. As we moved on into the BBQ that night the usual war, stories prevailed, as did the renewal of old friendships. It was a wonderful time, and guess what, during the BBQ the weather cleared! Snow capped mountains were visible and the helicopters could fly again.



In the middle of the celebrations, the good news came to us that the Gallants had been found. It was a good night.

Notwithstanding the miserable weather, the 2012's 6th June ceremony and gathering at the DTR was a success. The future and continuance of these events slowly comes into question, as we who are left are the ones committed to carry the torch and continue with the ceremony. Our numbers diminish yearly. However, if we do not carry the torch, then who will?

2013 offers us an opportunity for us to hold one of the biggest ceremonies to date...hopefully as an Airborne Brotherhood we will meet that challenge! Gentlemen, the Mountain awaits our return!

SIFFLEUR FALLS - JUNE 6th, 2013

June 2013, we will celebrate the 69th Anniversary of D-Day at the 1st Canadian Parachute Battalion Cairn located at Siffleur Falls Staging Area; a commitment we have undertaken now for the past 12 years. As in past years, the ceremony will be centered around the David Thompson Resort (DTR) and will follow the standard format, which will cover the June 5th – 7th timeframe. Special this year will be the capability for those who attend the D-Day Ceremony to follow up and join the Airborne Reunion in Edmonton, June 7th -9th. Those arriving from out of town for the reunion, arrangements are in the making to transport whoever wishes to attend to Siffleur on June 6th for the ceremony. This will provide a wonderful opportunity for those who have never attended the D-Day Ceremony at the Airborne Monument to do so.

Those who are interested in this adventure we asks you should book early and indicate whether or not you wish to partake in the ceremony by caravanning in convoy to Siffleur, or just coming for the day, this is a great opportunity to extend this week of Airborne activity into a memorable occasion.

CANADIAN AIRBORNE MEMORIAL CAIRN VILLAGE AT GRIESBACH - EDMONTON, ALBERTA

The Canadian Airborne Memorial Cairn is to be built in the Village at Griesbach at the Perron-Berger Park located on the West side of Pegasus Boulevard across from Patricia Lake and the "Airborne Plaza". The Perron-Berger Park has been named in honour of two paratroopers of the Canadian Airborne Regiment who were killed in 1974 during the Regiment's tour of Cyprus.

The purpose of the Memorial is to pay tribute to Canada's fallen paratroopers. It will also be a permanent reminder of Griesbach's proud

military heritage. Griesbach was home to several of airborne units: the 2nd Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, the Canadian Airborne Regiment, the Canadian Airborne Centre, and the Canadian Forces Parachute Maintenance Depot.

The planned design of the Memorial includes a 2.6 metre tall Cairn in the centre of a circular, concrete and grassed area 10.9 metres in diameter. The Cairn will be constructed of tyndall stone with a metal plaque of the Canadian Parachute Corps placed on its front. There will be three, 0.9 metre high, sloped, masonry walls radiating from the Cairn, positioned to resemble a propeller if viewed from above. A metal relief airborne Pegasus will be mounted on each of the two forward-facing walls and metal plaques of airborne units will be fixed to limestone boulders positioned around the grassed area at the rear of the site. Current estimated cost of the Memorial is \$65,000 with construction scheduled to commence in the late summer of 2013. A detailed plan for the Cairn is attached. Dedication of the Perron-Berger Park and sod turning for the Memorial is scheduled to take place during the Airborne Reunion in Edmonton, June 7th-9th 2013. A dedication ceremony for the Memorial will be held in June 2014.

Accordingly, the Canadian Airborne Memorial Cairn Project Committee is seeking your financial support and a donation will be greatly appreciated. All donations will be recognized on a Donor Honour Roll to be distributed at the Memorial dedication ceremony. In addition, all major donors, those contributing \$2,500 or more – will have their name placed on one of the walls of the Memorial.

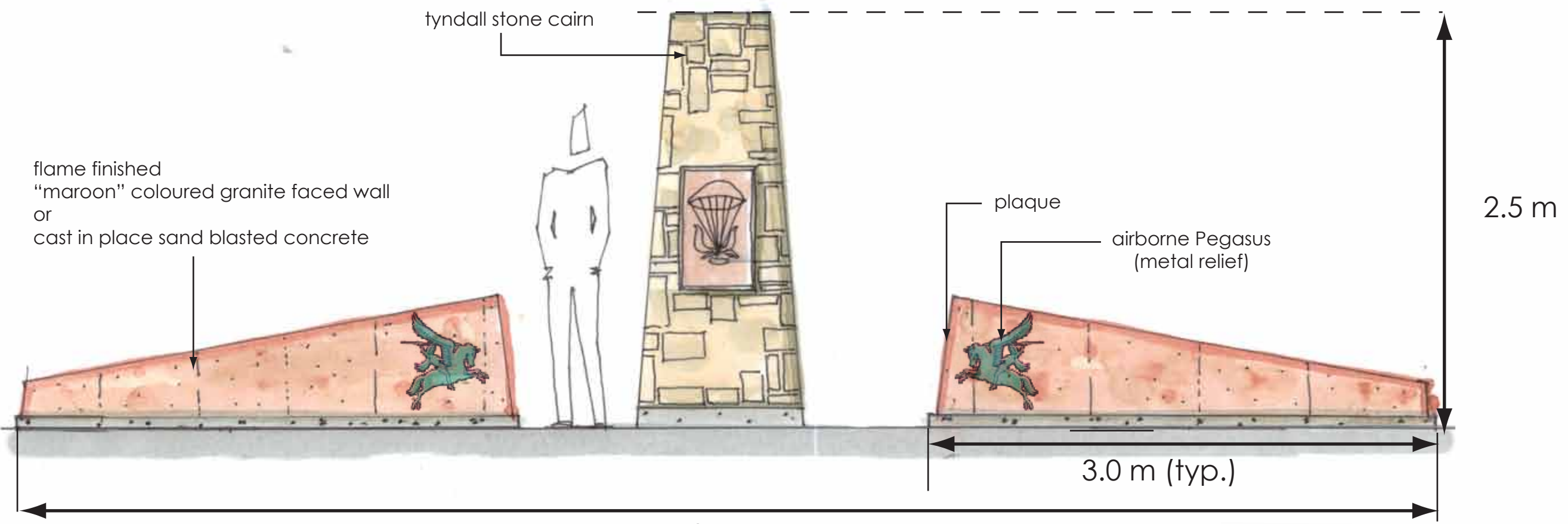

PARATROOPERS DOCUMENTARY AND BATTLE SCARS UPDATE SITREP

Hello and thank you for the opportunity to send greetings on behalf of myself, Dixon Christie and Bill Dickson. Over the past 4 years together, our production team has interviewed over 300 men and women and travelled across Canada to do so in the production of Paratroopers – The Canadian Story. The eight part movie series will chronicle Canada's military history over the past seven decades as experienced by our para-qualified veterans and soldiers.

As we have said goodbye to a number of friends that have passed away since we began our work, we feel stronger than ever in our conviction to complete the movie series. Last year while Shaw Television committed to airing the movie series and at the same time also committed to airing our new TV series called Battle Scars. Battle Scars was inspired by the veterans and soldiers we interviewed and the stories are about them and the experiences that the people we have met have had. Battle Scars allowed us to produce features to provide awareness about people, subjects and places that we could not include in the Paratroopers movie series. In Chilliwack for example, we produced a general segment on the Canadian Military Education Centre as well as three more on the vehicles.

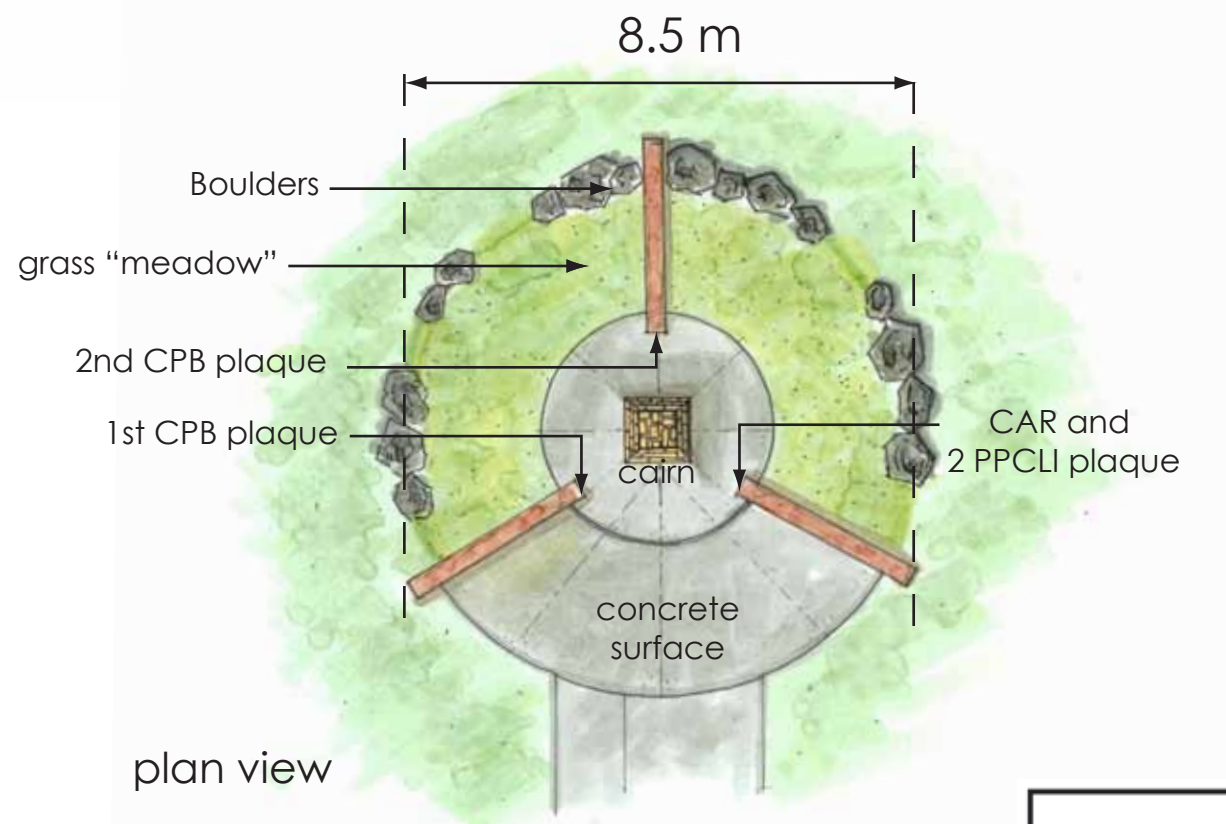
For the Battle Scars TV Series, we produced essential memorials on soldiers like Roger St John, Mike Starker, Bruce Edey, Phil Anley and Herb Norris. As well, we have produced five segments on the latest activities of the PPCLI and the life saving lessons we learned in Afghanistan from the new and improved tourniquet. In fact, through Battle Scars, we produced SEVENTY different segments Shaw TV has been broadcasting our now completed Season One of Battle Scars series in Edmonton and on the 10th of September began broadcasting the series across Alberta as we continue to expand our audience. they will be playing the 14 part series 10 times per week.

While the public response has been good, unfortunately, Shaw TV does not pay us for this series. They do NOT pay us anything. We have been raising funds for both productions through sponsorships, advertisers and our own funds. This unfortunately has forced us to push back the release of the Paratroopers documentary series until Remembrance Day 2013 when if all goes to plan, the series will be broadcast nationally.

The past year we have however confirmed the participation of Don Cherry who has an audience of up to 10 million Canadians per day on CBC. He called us to voice his continued support and reaffirm his participation in our projects. So, while the TV Series Battle Scars Season One continues to expand our audience, we are producing Season Two and at the same time, completing our extensive Paratroopers documentary series.

Fellow Jumpers,

I am writing to ask all members of ARAC and Paratroopers to once again answer the "riggers call" in support of the planned project for the Canadian Airborne Memorial Cairn, Edmonton, Alberta. In 2006, the Airborne Plaza and street names were dedicated in a special ceremony. This park was named after Perron and Berger. Many of you know, that Perron and Berger were two 1 Commando troopers who died during the 1974 Cyprus Conflict and were the only members of the Airborne Regiment who were killed in action but the Memorial Cairn will also represent all Canadian Airborne paratroopers who have fallen over the years throughout the world.

This Canadian Airborne Memorial Cairn will be the first of its kind that will not be on a Canadian military base but rather will be located in the former Griesbach Barracks where the Airborne Regiment was raised and where many soldiers served. The City of Edmonton and the Canada Lands Company are supporting the Canadian Airborne Memorial Cairn that is planned to be unveiled in June 2013. Bill Dickson and his "pathfinders" are in the lead to raise donations for the \$45,000 dollars required to build this long overdue memorial.

Enclosed with this letter are the details of how you can support this Canadian Airborne Memorial Cairn. A special coin representing the Memorial Cairn will be sent for each \$25.00 donated to the Airborne Regiment Association of Canada (ARAC). ARAC is donating the coin so that the entire \$25.00 will go towards the fundraising.

Further details involving the unveiling of the Canadian Airborne Memorial Cairn will be provided as we get closer to the event. It is therefore very important to include e-mail addresses if you have one. There is no doubt that this will be a national event that will have a significant presence for currently serving, as well as retired military members.

Your swift support will ensure that we will have a Canadian Airborne Memorial Cairn which the Canadian public and all Canadian paratroopers can be proud of.

J'écris pour demander aux membres de l'ARAC et tous les parachutistes, de répondre à l'appel du « maître de saut » et de soutenir le projet du Mémorial canadien aéroporté, à Edmonton, Alberta. En 2006, le « Airborne Plaza » (Place de l'Aéroporté) et les rues avoisinantes ont été inaugurées lors d'une cérémonie spéciale. Le parc a été surnommé « Perron et Berger ». Plusieurs d'entre-vous se souviennent que Perron et Berger étaient des paras du 1^{er} Commando qui ont perdu la vie en 1974 lors de la rébellion cyprite. Quoique ce furent les seuls membres du Régiment aéroporté à donner leur vie en servant sous les drapeaux, le Mémorial sert à honorer tous les parachutistes canadiens qui sont morts au cours des ans, à l'échelle mondiale.

Le Mémorial canadien de l'Aéroporté sera le premier du genre à être installé ailleurs que sur une base militaire canadienne. Il se trouvera sur le lieu des anciens quartiers de Griesbach où le Régiment aéroporté a été conçu et où ces soldats ont servi. La ville d'Edmonton et la Société immobilière du Canada soutiennent le projet prévu d'un cairn qui sera dévoilé officiellement en juin 2013. M. Bill Dickson et ses « pathfinders » (éclaireurs) sont les initiateurs d'une levée de fonds de plus de \$45,000 requis pour construire ce mémorial attendu depuis si longtemps.

Ci-joint, vous trouverez les informations comment apporter votre soutien au projet du Cairn mémorial de l'Aéroporté. Un médaillon de type « challenge coin » sera frappé pour chaque don de \$25 reçu par l'Association du Régiment aéroporté du Canada (ARAC). 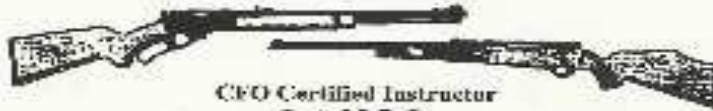
